Technical Writing Simplified – June 22, 2016

Matthew Bin, a local consultant and technical writer, presented "Technical Writing Simplified". This presentation targeted engineers, who often have to write or contribute to the documentation process.

Matthew explained that creating technical documentation isn't as difficult or onerous as it seems. drawing on his 20 years' experience and millions of words written for IT clients, he provided a number of approaches and tips for creating documentation. Numerous engineers working in a number of different disciplines asked questions, and a lively discussion ensued about approaches for engineers with imperfect English, and technologies for disseminating technical documentation.

Take your MPP to Work day - July 20, 2016

The PEO Oakville and Mississauga Chapters hosted the first-ever joint Take Your MPP to Work Day event on July 20th. It was an excellent partnership between the two chapters. The event was held at the Credit Valley Conservation (CVC) Authority and featured Labour Minister Kevin Flynn, MPP (Oakville); Associate Finance Minister Indira Naidoo-Harris, MPP (Halton); and Amrit Mangat, MPP (Mississauga-Brampton South), Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister Responsible for Women's Issues, and to the Minister Responsible for Accessibility. The visit allowed the politicians to meet several CVC professional engineers who explained the various stormwater management practices being used and the important role engineers play in protecting the environment and maintaining a safe supply of drinking water for the public.

Take Your MPP to Work Day helps to showcase the impact of professional engineers in their communities and inform politicians of the contributions the profession makes in protecting the public. To date, over 14 MPPs have taken part in 12 Take Your MPP to Work Day events hosted by 12 different PEO chapters. Minister Flynn and Associate Minister Naidoo-Harris each have participated in two such events. This was the first Take Your MPP to Work event for the Mississauga Chapter and the third for the Oakville Chapter.

Student Scholarships - July 30, 2016

Professional Engineers Ontario Oakville Chapter awarded three scholarships in 2016. The scholarships were awarded on the basis of academics, community contributions, extracurricular activities and the student's intention to pursue a career in the engineering profession. Advanced Analytics in the Metals Industry - Sept 29, 2016

On September 29, 2016, Richard MacRosty from the Hatch Technologies Group gave a talk on "Analytics in the Metals Industry" to members of the PEO Oakville/Milton Chapter. The presentation was well attended with engineers from many industries in the audience. The objective was to educate professionals about data analytics is and its potential application their industries and sectors.

Data analytics is the exploration of data to discover patterns; those patterns can be used to reveal information and provide insights about the system. Big data and analytics have received a lot of attention recently for their capability to convert an untapped resource (historical data) into a valuable asset. Used correctly, the methods are very powerful but they do have limitations. Understanding these limitations is important to avoid common pitfalls and achieve reliable outcomes. Aside from the specific algorithm used, there are a number of factors that need to be considered; including how the data is collected and utilized and how it is processed prior to the analysis. The involvement of process experts into the analysis is another key component of producing meaningful results.

The aim of the talk was to give some insight into some of these aspects without getting into the fine details of the algorithms. Some simple examples from the metals industry were used to demonstrate the capabilities.
