# **Ionizing Radiation in Medical Therapies** October 10, 2019

Dr. Jerry Cutler spoke to the PEO Oakville Chapter and the Canadian Nuclear Society about the use of ionizing radiation in medical therapies on Oct 10 2019. He presented the history of low dose radiation exposure to human beings. He has successfully performed clinical trials in using low dose radiation to treat Alzheimer's disease, dementia and certain types of cancer. His presentation was received with much interest by the 35 members in attendance.



Darren Gornall, President and Deep Singh, Director of Additive Manufacturing of CAD MicroSolutions gave a very informative presentation on how additive manufacturing is changing design. Prototypes of parts printed with 3D laser printers were displayed and discussed with the 35 members present. Many examples were given in the presentation showing how additive manufacturing is being used in various industries.



# Oakville Hydro Facility Tour July 5, 2019

Oakville Hydro, a subsidiary of Oakville Enterprises' (OEC) - regulated by the Ontario Energy Board, is an electricity distribution company in the local community. Using a sophisticated network of remotely switched power lines of approximately 1400 km, Oakville Hydro has reliably delivered energy to households and businesses for over a century.

Oakville Hydro's Control Room is the key component to contribute to its success. The operators monitor the distribution system 24-hours a day, 365 days per year. They also utilize Outage Management System to help predicting fault locations, enabling them to dispatch





crews directly to locations for investigation and resolving issues before they occur.

On the tour, chapter members gained a better understanding of Oakville Hydro operations and how they continue delivering the power that we need every day.

Over 20 students attended our yearly Junior Engineering Workshop at the Queen Elizabeth Parks and Recreation Centre to engage in a wide variety of STEM activities including Paper Structure Building, Electrical Circuit Composition and more!

### **Government Liaison Program Update**

The Government Liaison Program (GLP) was established to ensure that the government, PEO licence holders and the public continue to understand and recognize PEO's role in regulating the profession in the public interest. GLP goals include:

- Helping foster a better understanding of engineering work among Members of Provincial Parliament (MPPs);
- Increasing MPPs' understanding of PEO's regulatory role to protect the public interest;
- Offering unique knowledge and expertise to government before considering new policy related to engineering work and regulation of engineering; and
- Developing relationships among MPPs, local engineers and PEO chapters.

Our Chapter continues to build on the relationships with all three MPPs within our chapter's boundary (Stephen Crawford, Oakville MPP, Parm Gill, Milton MPP, and Effie Triantafilopoulos, Oakville North-Burlington MPP) that were established since the 2018 provincial election. Since this summer, all three MPPs have attended our annual picnic and BBQ at Kelso Conservation Area in June and encouraged our new P.Eng. licence recipients and provided congratulatory certificates to mark this milestone at the Fall Licence Presentation Ceremony in September. Through these opportunities, we reiterated the role of PEO as a self-regulating organization and its role in regulating the engineering profession in Ontario to protect the public interest.

In October, our GLP committee members joined others from all the East and West Central Regional Chapters at GLP Academy and Congress. At the meeting, we had a chance to be trained and share best practices and lessons-learned from our Chapter's past year GLP activities. In addition, our Chapter will look for future opportunities to collaborate with other chapters to further our GLP goals.

On November 29<sup>th</sup>, we will be hosting our 2019 "Take Your MPP to Work" at Rockwool Milton Facility for MPPs to learn how engineers and engineering played a role in the day-to-day operation at the facility and in the industry.
